Brad Hester (Jackpot Fireworks) stated that the Fourth of July fireworks all went off. There were no shells left in the tubes. It was a pretty good show, but there were many fires. The public work guys cut a lot of fire line for them which helped, the fire department, and BLM were also there for fire coverage. The fire department helped with the physical part of the job days prior to the show which helped tremendously. Mr. Hester mentioned that Thomas Ingersoll is a new member of the crew who helps shoot. He couldn't see how many people were in attendance, but the finale was awesome, now it's time to order the Christmas fireworks.

TOWN OF JACKPOT

- a. Raft River Electric Company update of the electrical service provided to the town of Jackpot.

Mike Christensen (Raft River Rural Electric) stated that there wasn't anything too new. He thanked the community for their patience during the power outage. He commented that there was good feedback regarding the public works guys that help the linemen when there is an outage or when help is needed and that also includes the clerk who helps with the payments from the community.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) thanked Mr. Christensen for the safety trailer demonstration.

Brent Fleshman (Jackpot Golf Club) stated that it's that time of the year where they are chasing the dry spots and trying to keep the golf course green. The course is in good shape and things are going well. They just finished yesterday one of the top three tournaments that they have every year called the Valley Rowdies. There are a couple hundred guys from Southern Idaho, it's a big tournament that goes on for a couple of days. It was successful.

He mentioned that everything is top notch. The new well system is working well.

There was a bunch of random people from Elko who all commented how much nicer the course is compared to Ruby View in Elko. This was nice to hear because Elko has thirty thousand people and the resources to play that course compared to the Jackpot which has one thousand people and only a few who play, so the course is based on transient play and tournaments. There were many comments, and his superintendent was also there to hear them. It's nice to hear especially since everybody is working hard in the heat. It would be nice to get some thunderstorms with rain. Things are going good.

JACKPOT RECREATION CENTER

- A. Recreation Department operations update.
NON ACTION ITEM

Beth Lamb (Jackpot Aquatic Center) was absent, Lindsey Merrymen stated that the pool has been fixed now. The pool opened on Tuesday, and they have already had thirteen swimmers in the two days that it has been open. In regard to the pool there were sixty-three people the previous month calling about it. The fitness area had two hundred forty-eight people and the those that just lounge around there were one hundred seventy-seven for the month of June.

She reiterated that in July they have already thirteen people in the pool, and it has only been open three days. There have been thirty-eight plus in the fitness area, and forty that just have lounged around. The deposit for six hundred forty-one dollars and fifty cents for June accounts was receivable.

Chairperson Teresa Hugill asked how long the pool was closed. Mrs. Merrymen stated from July third to Tuesday. No other comments were made, and Chairperson Hugill thanked Mrs. Merrymen for the report.

JACKPOT PUBLIC WORKS

1. Public Works water, sewer, landfill, streets, and operations update.

Gustavo Estrada (Jackpot Public Works) stated that they have been fixing things here and there and it seems like the heat has been hard on things the last couple of days. They are getting stuff from the budget and getting items ordered that have been on back order. The Fourth of July went well.

JACKPOT SAFETY / FIRE

Shelly Hester (Jackpot ambulance) stated that for the month of June they had eighteen calls and six of those were transports. She will be finishing up by the end of the month all the department's CPR renewals.

2. **Jackpot Fire Department**

- a. Jackpot Fire Department operations update.

Brian Hugill (Jackpot Fire Chief) stated that there were thirty-five calls, twelve service calls, four vehicle accidents, and one vehicle fire. He commented that he and Jose (Jackpot Fire Department) arrived from the State Fire Marshal Academy. They both passed with flying colors their certifications and now are waiting for the Love's to come in so that they can move forward.

He mentioned that in Wildcat there is a fire and there are fifteen aircrafts on it. This is near O'Neal Basin and it's creating its own thunderstorms.

Elko County Sheriff's Department

- a. Sheriff Office operations update.

Deputy Albert Sevier stated that there have been several animal accidents over the last couple weeks. They are stepping up enforcement in town, they have stopped several trucks blowing through the lights the last couple of days. They haven't had any major calls.

Deputy Mike Pace commented that there haven't been any major calls. The only calls they have gotten are disturbing the peace or fights at Cactus Petes.
