MINUTES**

THURSDAY, June 11, 2020

6:00 P.M. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting of the Jackpot Advisory Board was called to order by Chairwoman Hugill at 6:00 pm mountain standard time on June 11, 2020 in meeting room of the Jackpot Senior Center Building, Jackpot, Nevada.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE GALLERY:

Chairwoman Hugill advised the public to step to the front of the room to identify themselves and to speak clearly for the record. She stated that they should try and not speak out of turn or among themselves. If anybody has a cell phone it should be muted and if a call needs to be answered it must be taken outside.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Chairwoman Hugill led the pledge of allegiance.

COMMENTS BY THE GENERAL PUBLIC:

Pursuant to N.R.S. 241.020, 2 (c) (3), this time is devoted to comments by the general public, if any, and discussion of those comments. No action may be taken upon a matter raised during a period devoted to comments by the general public until the matter itself has been specifically included on a successive agenda and identified to be an action item.

Brad Hester (Jackpot Fireworks) stated that the fireworks have been ordered. It will be the same as every year and there will also be extra new racks included, since many places have cancelled their shows.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) commented that there is a conex where the fireworks can be stored if they arrive a few days prior to the Fourth of July.

Tim Bruebaker (Deuces Wild Car Show) stated that he had gotten the okay from Cactus Petes to have the car show.

Chairwoman Teresa Hugill commented that if he needed anything from the advisory board to let them know and that Tara Norris (Event Coordinator) could also help him.

Mr. Bruebaker mentioned that he would like to invite past winners from the car show to participate in the town's Fourth of July parade, but he would like help from the town board and Cactus Petes.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that he could discuss this in further detail once the topic of the parade was mentioned.

Theresa Dimmitt (Jackpot Tourism Director) stated that on the town website the car show is included as a special event and she's got the flyer that he's sent her but would like to know if there is anything else, he would like included.

Mr. Bruebaker commented that he would give Mrs. Dimmitt's information to Vickie so that they could get in contact.

Chairwoman Hugill congratulated Mr. Bruebaker for being one of the first events in the town.

Mr. Bruebaker commented that it was mentioned that he may be the only event this year. He won't be advertising it as such.

TOWN OF JACKPOT

- a. Raft River Electric Company update of the electrical service provided to the town of Jackpot.

Heath Higley (Raft River Electric) stated that things have been pretty quiet, and they haven't had any calls from people in the town.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) commented that the last two days he's talked to Carl and Chad.

Brad Hester (Jackpot fireworks) mentioned that he and other friends have experienced power bumps in the last several days.

Mr. Higley stated that the only power bumps he knew about were during the storm.

Mr. Hester commented that the power bumps he was talking about were during calm days and they were strong enough to reset all the clocks in his house.

Mr. Higley mentioned that this was the first time he's heard about this and asked if was only on that side of the town.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that they experienced this at the Cactus Petes trailer court.

Mr. Hester mentioned that some teachers in the teacher's court also had this issue.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that in the Twin Springs apartments this also happened.

Monica Burt (Jackpot Advisory Board member) commented that the power bumps were quick.

Shawn Mathis (Vice-Chairman) mentioned that Saturday was the last time it happened midmorning because he got a call from Cactus Petes.

Mr. Higley stated the he would look into this and would ask the ladies in the office if they saw anything on their end. He mentioned that he hadn't been aware of this issue when he spoke to (unnamed person) last Saturday.

Mr. Ririe commented that one of the power bumps was strong enough to start the generators.

Chairwoman Hugill asked if the company was planning on raising their rates.

Mr. Higley stated that they weren't planning on it. They have continued to work, their office doors are closed to the public, and the crews spread out reporting to different yards. They work like normal and respond anytime they are needed.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that she hopes everything is back to the same thing soon.

Mr. Higley agreed, stated that he would check into the power bumps, and for people to call if anything is needed.

b. Nevada Health Center update.

No Representatives present.

c. Discussion and consideration to start the town's own food bank.

ACTION ITEM

Theresa Dimmitt (Jackpot Tourism Director/Food Program) stated that she and Tammy (Friends In Service Helping Friends) (FISH) have talked about the town having its own food bank instead of a food pantry through this organization.

The town board has also talked about working with Northern Nevada Food Bank and having the town's own 501 c 3 Non-profit. This would require a full-time position. The food bank could work alongside the LDS Church because that is where the supplies has been from since stores are having a hard time stocking their shelves. The LDS Church has been helping the FISH food bank.

She mentioned that once the Covid emergency status is reduced, people will have to meet a certain criteria to continue getting the products. There is a different application for every single type of family there is.

Mrs. Dimmitt recommends that the town continue working with FISH and leave this item on hold. The town will need to have a food bank for six months before qualifying for a 501 c 3 Non-profit, unless the town works alongside the LDS Church than it would be easier because they've got their food pantry established. The town could use their 501 C 3.

She stated that she has done the research on this and has also talked to Tammy who says that things are working well the way they are now as long as the town continues sending somebody for the food. The only concern that Tammy has is the weather changing and the travel during the winter months.

Mrs. Dimmitt commented that the town would begin to stock more items before the weather got too bad. There wouldn't be any produce or the fridge/freezer commodities, but the pantry section would be stocked. She stated that her recommendation would be to forgo this because for starters a bigger room or building would be needed. There is a section in the packet that explains all the requirements that the room needs to have.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that if this required hiring somebody the town wouldn't be able to do this.

Mrs. Dimmitt commented that it could be volunteers. The job would require record keeping of each family and reports that need to be done. She stated that she gets information from the families and the ladies in Elko take care of everything else.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that if things are working well with the way they are doing things now they should continue doing it that way for now.

Mrs. Dimmitt commented that at least until the winter months start. The only benefit she see's to having the town's own food bank is that the food would be delivered instead of somebody going to Elko and picking it up. She mentioned that Bill (Tourism President) and her pick up produce once a week, but this will only be temporary. The pantry and freezer/fridge items are only a once a month pickup.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that once people begin to work she doesn't think there will be many asking for help.

Mrs. Dimmitt commented that there is around eighty people in the community receiving the food. She thinks that this amount will be less and those who are struggling will be the ones who will remain in the program.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) mentioned that a one million dollar coverage is needed, but he's wondering if it's for the town or solely the program. He stated that if it's only for the program this wouldn't be happening.

Mrs. Dimmitt commented that she thinks it would be for the program.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that these requirements are meant for bigger places.

Mr. Burt commented that it's places like Elko.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that there are more things to look into and if Mrs. Dimmitt ever feels overwhelmed, she needs to let somebody know.

Mrs. Dimmitt commented that her grandson, husband and the fire department have helped her. It's a town effort because the public work technicians are the ones going to Elko once a month.

No Motion made. The advisory board tabled this item for the following month to give them more time to study the food bank packet.

JACKPOT GOLF COURSE

1. Golf Course operations update.
NON ACTION ITEM

Brent Fleshman (Jackpot Golf Course) was absent, but he emailed a letter to give an update.

Chairwoman Hugill read the letter, "For the golf course report, nothing major brewing. Business has picked up slightly with the casino and hotels opening, but still well short of previous years. Which is expected as some people are still very apprehensive on travel. We are using procedures for sanitizing carts, bathrooms and common areas. We have limited seating in clubhouse and are only allowing food to go orders. Golf course is in great shape and a full staff is currently employed. Otherwise, looking forward to more business headed are way. I'm always available for questions or concerns by email or phone. Thank you."

Chairwoman Hugill commented that at least the golf course is getting more people since the hotels have opened.

JACKPOT TOURISM

1. Tourism operations update.
ACTION ITEM

Theresa Dimmitt (Jackpot Tourism Director) stated that the townofjackpot.com website is live. It's still being worked on but live for people who want to visit the site after seeing the billboards. She is hiding the pages that aren't done, so people don't have access to those.

She asks that if anybody finds a typo or anything to let her know because after working on it for a while and making sure things look correct there can still be mistakes made. She mentioned that Miles Partnership the people who are working on the town's Google presence would like to send their photographer the first week in July. This service has been paid for, but they would like for the town to find him a place to stay.

Mrs. Dimmitt commented that she would make some calls to the hotels in town.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot board member) asked what part of the week because of the Fourth of July.

Mrs. Dimmitt stated that it would be in the beginning of the week.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that it would be better during the week compared to a weekend.

Mrs. Dimmitt mentioned that there is one more training with them and it will be the following Monday at two.

Monica Burt (Jackpot board member) commented that she tried searching the website and there were no results.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that it should be working now.

Vice-Chairman Shawn Mathis commented that he was able to find the website.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that the special event tab redirected people to Google. This was the only thing she saw that wasn't working.

Mrs. Dimmitt stated she would fix this.

Mrs. Burt mentioned that after a while of people searching the website it will start to appear more. This happened with the original website that she had made. It took four or five months after having people search it to start appearing more when people typed in town of Jackpot. She suggests that another mailer be sent out once the website is complete.

Mrs. Dimmitt stated that she could do another mailer, but once the website is complete the Facebook page will automatically promote it. She mentioned that there are still funds available from this fiscal year to boost things on Facebook.

Vice-Chairman Mathis mentioned that the link for "our community" returns back to the top of the page.

Mrs. Dimmitt stated that she would fix all these issues.

Mrs. Burt commented that the original page “townofjackpot.net” is still appearing even it doesn’t go anywhere, but the Revize people can make it so anybody is reverted to the townofjackpot.com website.

Mrs. Dimmitt stated she would mention this to them.

Chairwoman Hugill asked about the name of the shooting range.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) stated that Travis Hartman (Public Works Lead Technician) paid for the sign. He commented that Mr. Hartman asked him about the name being “Bloom Shooting Range” because Jeff Bloom (Public Works Technician) did the majority of the work on it.

JACKPOT EVENTS

2. Event Operations update.

Tara Norris (Event Coordinator) stated that there will be a Fourth of July parade. It will be different this year because instead of starting at the recreation center and ending at the park it will start over by where Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent)/ Monica Burt (Jackpot Advisory Board member) and Brad Hester (Jackpot Fireworks)/Shelly Hester (Jackpot Ambulance) live and ending on the other end of the town.

Brian Hugill (Jackpot Fire Chief) mentioned that he posted on Facebook about the fireworks and people have commented and called asking about the parade. He stated that the town needs this and everybody will need to practice social distancing. This will be done during the parade because everybody will be in their own vehicle.

He commented that there will be two events in the town. The parade will be first and he and Mr. Burt have also been talking about a softball game after, with people bringing their own bbq’s. The town won’t be hosting the bbq this year, but everybody could be in the same area following social distancing.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that it may need to be worded different to people so they know that everybody will need to do their own grilling on their bbq.

Mr. Hugill commented that Mike Moore mentioned that the “J” on top of the hill looked horrible and they should do something about. Mr. Hugill and Mr. Burt began working on it the last two days and they decided that the following Thursday they would be getting up early to reclaim the “J” and the town.

There will be fire fighters and some law enforcement doing this. He will be posting on Facebook that there will be a parade.

Mr. Burt commented that this could also be posted on the town’s Facebook page.

Mr. Hugill stated that it needs to be advertised.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that the message also needs to include social distancing guidelines.

Mr. Hugill commented that they would also ask for volunteers to help with the “J.” He stated that they would be meeting at seven in the morning on Thursday to paint it. He mentioned that they would like to get the town and people’s moral up and going.

Ms. Norris stated that she would work on organizing the parade and contacting Coral Roe (Jackpot Town member) to start organizing the participants.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that people have asked if they would be able to throw candy. She thinks that people should be following social distancing, so when it’s thrown it should be okay.

Mr. Burt mentioned that when the candy is being bagged the person’s doing it will be wearing gloves along with everybody throwing it out. There will be precautions used at all times.

He commented that he had purchased the paint for the “J.”

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that the school normally takes care of the “J,” but they haven’t in some time.

Vice-Chair Shawn Mathis commented that due to the weather it couldn’t be done this year because his son Ryan was supposed to do, but it got cancelled.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot board member) asked if there would be floats from out of town.

Ms. Norris stated that she would be checking with Mrs. Roe because she had many things organized, but she had to cancel because the parade had been cancelled previously. Ms. Norris commented that she knew Mrs. Roe would be contacting Mr. Ririe to have him include for vehicles in the parade from Cactus Petes. She will also be contacting Barton’s 93, West Star, Pony Express, and the Four Jacks.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that they could also include the school seniors.

Tim Bruebaker (Deuces Car Show) mentioned that he had talked to past winners of the car show about being in the parade. There were some who said that if they were available, they would do it. He was going to talk to Cactus Petes about giving them a free night stay because he won’t ask them to pay for a trip and a room to be in the parade.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that a discounted rate would also help. They could even talk to the person at the West Star.

Mr. Bruebaker mentioned that if those people spent the night in the town they would gamble and spend money in the town.

Ms. Norris asked if anybody knew when the Horseshu would be opening.

Mr. Ririe stated that it wouldn’t be for six more months.

Mr. Bruebaker mentioned that Mr. Hugill suggested the first year winner who has a deuce truck attend and allow the advisory board members to ride in the back of it in the parade. There wouldn't be any convertibles. He may be asking the guy from Utah, but he doubts he'll make the trip for a parade. He has talked to Bob Tedder with the fifty-five Chevy, Gerald with the Pontiac, and he'll probably ask Ed. There will be three if he can get them a night.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that they would see how the town could help.

Mr. Bruebaker stated that this could be great advertising. He will also have his granddaughter walking with a banner. He mentioned that he would need to know soon about the rooms, so he could make sure his contacts aren't busy doing something else.

Mr. Burt asked if Mr. Bruebaker would be promoting the burnout competitions.

Mr. Bruebaker stated yes, it has added to his car show.

JACKPOT SENIOR CENTER

3. Senior Center Operations update.
NON ACTION ITEM

Mary Hess (Senior Center) was absent. Chairwoman Hugill commented that Ms. Hess would be released from the hospital on Monday. Ms. Hess has hindered around the idea of not overseeing the senior center anymore and this can be discussed in further detail if it happens.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) and Chairwoman Hugill both agreed that there haven't been any guidelines regarding senior centers.

Mr. Burt recommends that until the governor has something for senior centers that the community continue to check on the seniors at their homes.

Monica Burt (Jackpot Advisory Board member) thanked the fire department for checking in on the seniors in their homes.

JACKPOT RECREATION CENTER

- A. Recreation Department operations update.
NON ACTION ITEM

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) stated that the recreation center opened on the first for eight hours. In the first week there were twenty-nine people who went for the fitness equipment. He's also seen people asking for information, so he isn't sure of how many worked out. There is an average of five people in the first week.

He mentioned that the previous week the hours were reduced from eleven to five and there were thirty-eight people, an average of nine people a day. They will continue to monitor the amount of people and may have to reduce the hours even more.

Tara Norris (Event Coordinator) asked if he had an idea of when the pool would be in operation.

Mr. Burt stated that it depends on the economy.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that they would need to reevaluate things. She commented that it had been decided the pool would remain closed for now.

Mr. Burt stated that the heat has been turned off and the only thing for people to do is play the games. The ping-pong table is sanitized once people stop playing it. There is a sanitizing table with rags and a disinfectant for people who workout to sanitize the equipment.

He commented that the machines have been moved further out. The recreation center won't be doing the food program this year for the children. The school will continue to provide the lunches until the beginning of the school year.

He doesn't have the times for this, but Brian Messmer (Jackpot School Principal) would be contacting him. The school will continue with the same setup for the summer food program.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that this needs to be posted on the website because not many children may know about the lunches.

JACKPOT PUBLIC WORKS

1. Public Works water, sewer, landfill, streets and operations update.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) stated that he requested five thousand dollars for the car show, and he will know in July if he got those funds or not. If the funds are in the budget, he will have Brad Hester (Fireworks) order them for the car show. He knows there are twenty thousand dollars for the Fourth of July fireworks and five thousand dollars for Christmas party if it can be done.

He stated that the public work technicians have been busy cleaning the streets and roads. He mentioned that volunteers are needed because starting Monday they will be mowing all the empty lots. They will start on the lot South of Cactus Pete's property towards the Vinion property. He would like for this to be posted on Facebook.

He commented that they need to clean these areas to make the town look nice. He'll have definite times before this gets posted. He commented that they will need as many volunteers as they can get.

Chairwoman Hugill asked if people would need to take their own lawn mowers.

Mr. Burt stated that no. The public works department would be using their equipment to brush mow it. They need people walking in front of them to remove big rocks or trash so, their equipment isn't being destroyed. They will work their way towards the Spanish Garden rv park, by the sidewalks, and all empty lots around the town. This will be a big project. The more volunteers there are the faster it can be finished.

He commented that they will start this project on Monday and will work on it on Tuesday also, as for the rest of the week they will see how the project is progressing. He hopes everything will look good once they are done. The town needs this because there are serious fire issues around town.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that there are serious garbage issues around town.

Mr. Burt stated that that everybody would be working together. He hopes community members help along with people from the different businesses.

Monica Burt (Jackpot Advisory Board member) commented that maybe somebody could help take the trash to the dumping area.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that people could fill trash bags and leave them in a corner for others to take them to the dump.

Mr. Burt stated that this could be done also, but the people will be picking the trash ahead of the brush hog and the side-by-side will be there for them to throw the bags of trash into it, so it can be hauled off.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that maybe after that they could post something so people could help clean the town also.

Mr. Burt stated that they would like to see the lots cleaned before the Fourth of July and to maintain them because of the car show event.

He commented that they have been busy working on projects and with the recreation center.

Chairwoman Hugill asked what it would take to get more lights on highway 93.

Vice-Chair Shawn Mathis commented that this is something that the state takes care of.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that she knew, so she's wondering if letters need to be written.

Mr. Burt commented that he spoke with Heath Higley (Raft River Electric) and that he needs to wait for the accident report. He will be sending this report to Boyd Ratliff (NDOT).

Chairwoman Hugill stated that the crosswalk worked, but it doesn't work when people aren't using it.

Mr. Burt commented that it's one of the issues because technically it isn't a crosswalk intersection. He mentioned that he spoke with Mr. Higley to ask for his help with installing a pole and getting power to it. He will be lighting that corner on Ace.

He stated that the previous year he requested that the state include highway 93 for a lighting project under economic development for rural counties, but it probably wasn't done. This is the reason why he's waiting on a copy of the accident report, so he can send it to Mr. Ratliff. This will show what happened because there is no lighting.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that people are driving through the town at ridiculous speeds.

Tara Norris (Event Coordinator) mentioned that she was almost hit by a semi last year crossing that same area.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that she was heading to her doctor's appointment and there was vehicle going at least fifty miles.

Ms. Norris commented that this is being done all the time because she sees it at work.

Theresa Dimmitt (Tourism Director) mentioned that they need to figure out a way to get their attention.

Brian Hugill (Jackpot Fire Chief) stated that the driver involved in the accident was paying attention, had he not there would've been a big grease spot in the middle of the street. The driver was alert in the middle of the night, but there was a man dressed in black who was crossing the street not walking well. This driver could've have dragged the pedestrian down the road. He was so distraught because he could've killed the pedestrian, but he decided to turn the truck sideways and bounce the pedestrian off of it, instead of hitting him dead center and running over him.

Mr. Hugill commented that Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) could attest to Steve (Pedestrian) not being able to walk well. He was also wearing all black because Mr. Hugill saw him that night.

He reiterated that the driver was paying attention and that the Mike (Officer) would say the same thing.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that there are still other people speeding.

Mr. Hugill stated that local people do it also and that corner is dark. He and Mr. Burt have talked about it.

Mr. Burt commented that the property doesn't belong to the town and it would cost the town three hundred thousand dollars to light up the area. This won't be happening anytime soon. He stated that he and Mr. Higley will be looking at some intersections and if can be done in the town they will do it.

He mentioned that he's seen people pressing the PED sign and vehicles aren't stopping. He stated that highway 93 is an issue.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that in other small towns people are speeding also because she's witnessed it on her way to Phoenix. She doesn't slow all the way down, but she doesn't drive by doing sixty or seventy miles through either like people do in the town. There also is no cop in those towns

Mr. Burt stated that it's a dangerous area and at night it's worse because there are no lights.

Chairwoman Hugill noticed how dark the area looks because somebody was live filming and she remembered a conversation about lights in that area.

Mr. Burt stated that he's been on NDOT for the last two years to keep the town included in a grant to get lighting.

Mr. Hugill mentioned that the board may want to write a letter.

Chairwoman Hugill stated that if a letter is needed, they need to work on one.

Officer Mike Pace commented that once a pedestrian is outside a vehicle's travel lane, there is no need to stop or slow down. This is a law. If there is a pedestrian halfway through the road going East to West and the North bound traffic doesn't stop and they are in the South bound lanes the North bound traffic doesn't have to slow down or stop. They can go through the light.

Chairwoman Hugill mentioned that she stops even if the pedestrian is on the other side so the traffic on the other side stops also.

Officer Pace stated that the law used to be that if pedestrians were in a crosswalk both sides had to stop, but it's no longer this way.

Mrs. Dimmitt mentioned that in California people had to stop if pedestrians stepped off the curb.

Officer Pace reiterated that it used to be the same in Nevada and people were obligated to stop, but not anymore.

Mr. Burt commented that the flag is installed. He is waiting on a new light because that will sit on the top and flare down on it unlike the lights it has now which are on the base.

Chairwoman Hugill thanked Mr. Burt for getting this done and everybody agreed that it looked nice.

JACKPOT SAFETY / FIRE

1. **Jackpot Ambulance**

- a. Jackpot Ambulance operations update.

Shelly Hester (Jackpot ambulance) stated that for the previous month there were 12 calls and 7 of those were transports. In the last couple of days there have been more. She is currently working with the EMT class and getting a testing date set for them. They should've tested in March, but everything was put on hold.

2. **Jackpot Fire Department**

- a. Jackpot Fire Department operations update.

Brian Hugill (Jackpot Fire Chief) stated that they responded to 17 calls. He mentioned that he and his crew would be helping Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) on Monday. He commented that they would also be loading and delivering groceries to people the following day.

Chairwoman Hugill asked about the date they would be painting the “J.”

Mr. Hugill stated that it would be the following Thursday at seven in the morning.

Chairwoman Hugill commented that Mr. Hugill and his crew are appreciated for what they do with the groceries.

Mr. Hugill stated that the people are happy. He and his crew have found people who need things and many of them are thankful. They have been to some homes where they thought the people were okay but weren't. They have also been to hard to reach places, but it's okay because it allows them to see what they have to do in case of an emergency in these homes or responding in those counties.

He commented that their primary response area for medical and structure fires now includes the original Winecup property which is located on the goose creek area. It's where the California trail comes in out there in three corners. There is an address where both law enforcement and they have to respond. Its forty-four miles.

He thanked the board and Mr. Burt for keeping their budget intact. He and his crew appreciate it.
